Advanced Criminal Investigations: This five day course is designed to provide an overview of various types of advanced criminal investigative techniques, as well as provide specific knowledge that law enforcement officers can use in their day-to-day activities. Blocks of instruction are designed primarily for patrol officers and detectives. Depending on instructor availability, topics may include gang identification and culture, major case management, child sexual exploitation, undercover matters, evidence recovery, human trafficking and narcotics detection and concealment. **No limit to class size.**

Advanced Interview & Interrogation: This two day course is designed for experienced investigators and will cover the following areas: preparing for an interview, the background interview, Miranda warnings, non-verbal behavior, verbal behavior, the behavior analysis interview, and the eight step interrogation method. **Class size is limited to 30.**

Crisis Negotiation: This five day course is designed to familiarize police officers with the current doctrine and theory of successful negotiation with individuals who are suicidal or in crisis, as well as criminal, mentally deranged and fanatic hostage takers. Instruction stresses the goal of approach in dealing with the hostage taker. Through the use of practical problems, all officers are exposed to negotiation situations during the course. Attendees should be patrol officers or detectives who will act as negotiators during actual crisis situations. Selection should be based on the department's ability to identify personnel who are enthusiastic and highly motivated to become crisis negotiators. **Class size is limited to 24.**

Ethics for the Police Executive: This is a two day course to give individuals with the rank of lieutenant or higher the training tools for developing ethical decision making skills both in themselves and their fellow officers. It focuses on choices and decisions that officers are confronted with on a daily basis and is a key ingredient in developing and maintaining an ethical climate within any police agency. Topics will include the state of American society, ethics as philosophy, basic ethics, ethical decision making in actual field situations, ethical choices, adult training and instructional techniques refresher and a practical exercise in a scenario format. Class size is limited to 35.

Fundamentals of Undercover Work: (NEW for 2010) This one day training is designed for law enforcement officers who have done some limited undercover work or anticipate being called upon to do undercover work based upon ethnicity, language ability or some other characteristic or skill. This course will be a combination of classroom instruction and practical exercises. Topics will include: creation of a legend and backstopping of the alias identity, establishing rapport with targets, negotiation, characteristics of a successful undercover employee, wearing a wire, security issues for undercover employees, psychological factors and legal issues involved with undercover work. This will be an interactive course and students will be expected to participate in scenarios involving role players. Class size is limited to 20.

Identifying Warning Signs of School Violence: This one day training provides information for law enforcement and school administration personnel, as well as mental health professionals, who may be tasked with responding to threatening situations in school environments. The focus of this training is the identification, assessment and management of potential threats. This is not an “active shooter” response course. No limit to class size.

Investigating Crimes in an Electronic Age: This two day course provides an orientation into the world of computers, the Internet and how both can assist in various types of criminal investigations. Blocks of instruction may include an introduction to computers and the Internet, electronic crime investigations, identity theft, online fraud and online sexual exploitation of children. No limit to class size.

Leadership and Supervision: This five day course is designed for first line supervisors in law enforcement departments and/or agencies and includes an examination of interpersonal communication, ethical considerations, managing the problem employee, motivation, delegation, problem-solving and stress management. Also included are DISC behavior assessments, Ken Blanchard’s Situational Leadership II model and practical exercises in management and leadership. Class size is limited to 30.

Spanish for Law Enforcement Officers: This five day course is designed for patrol and investigative officers who interact with Spanish speaking individuals. Basic commands and terminology utilized in the course of police business will be the focus. Some Spanish language knowledge is required. Class size is limited to 20.

Successful Media Interactions: (NEW for 2010) This one day class is designed for all levels of law enforcement personnel who interact with media. The focus of this course will be to develop a media strategy beginning with a simple press release formula. Students will learn to use the formula to develop verbal statements and guide press conferences. This course will culminate in a mock press conference exercise and critique. Class size is limited to 20.

Tier II – Advanced Counterterrorism: This two day course (offered in conjunction with the New Jersey Office of Homeland Security and Preparedness) will provide a comprehensive analysis of both international and domestic terrorism groups, terrorist threat indicators, informant development and terrorist financing and will feature case study presentations. Pre-requisite: Basic Counterterrorism (offered through the NJ Office of Homeland Security). No limit to class size.
